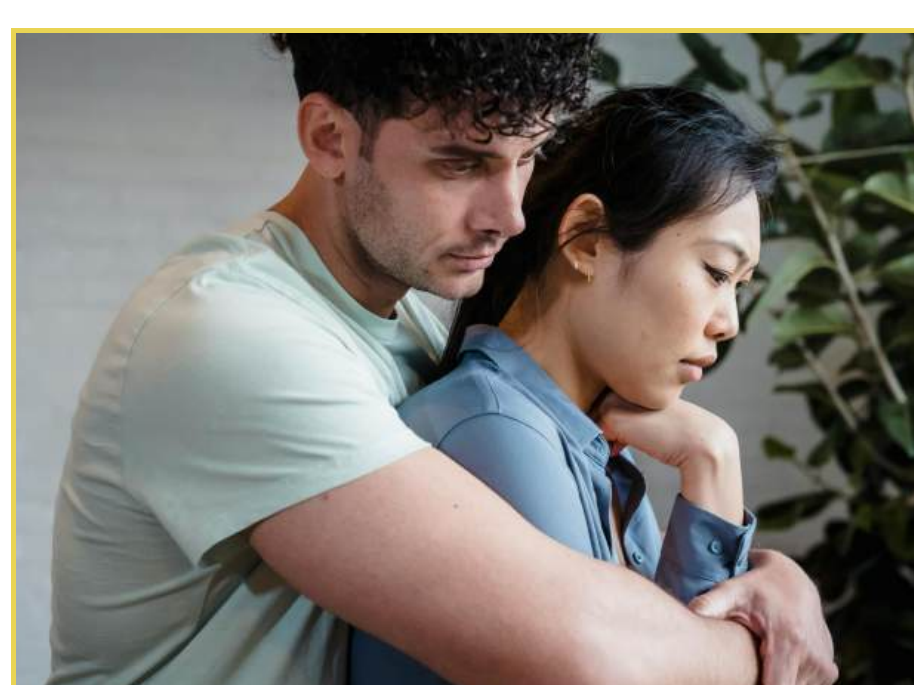
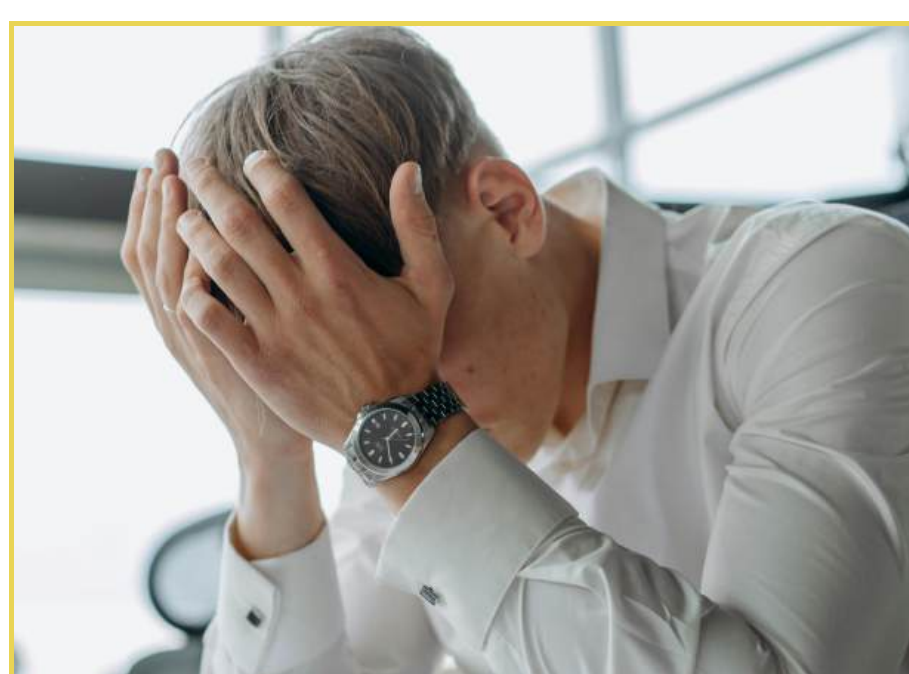


Signs Addiction Erodes Financial Integrity

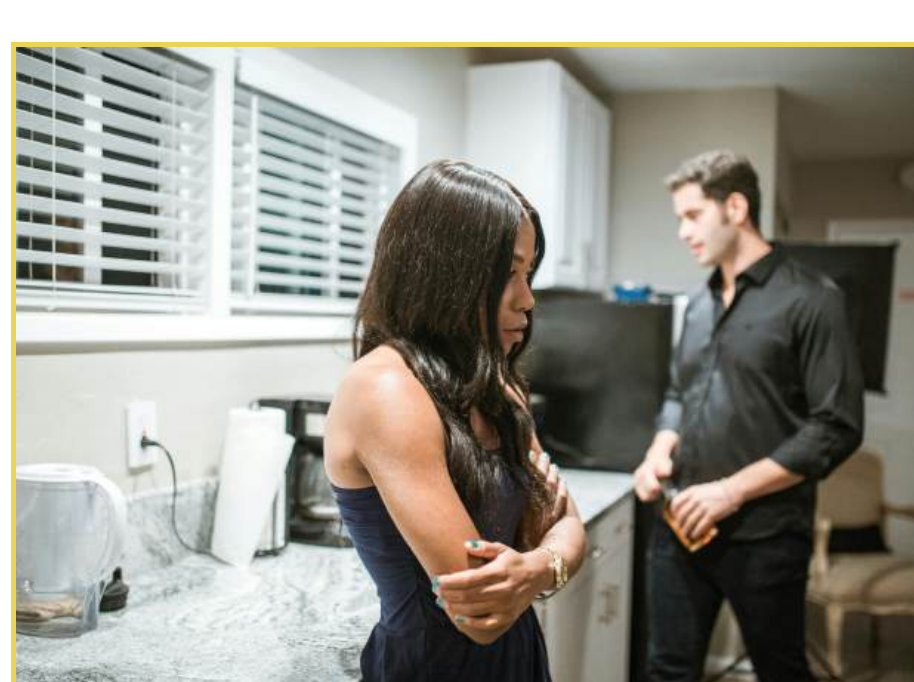


4. The Cost of Guilt
